Paediatric epilepsies contribute significantly to morbidity and mortality among the noncommunicable disorders of childhood. In the African setting, there is lack of trained personnel, delayed diagnosis and inequitable resources distribution to mitigate the lifelong consequences of living with epilepsy.

The PAZ partnered with ILAE to train key personnel in the correct diagnosis, appropriate investigation, treatment and comprehensive care of children with epilepsy using evidence-based PET training package delivered by the BPNA.

Members of the Paediatric Association of Zimbabwe, consisting of paediatricians, nurses and administrative staff were invited to undergo three day Training of Trainers workshop under the guidance of the BPNA faculty members. Travel and accommodation bursaries were granted for the delegates coming from Zimbabwe.
